EW furniture was a dream come true for Sbongile China Mkwanazi, the principal of Ward 2 Ramsgate Crèche, who waited for some 14 years for the school.

Addressing those at the handover, HCM mayor, Councillor Cynthia Mqwebu, praised Ms Mkwanazi for her love of teaching the young children and bringing them up in the correct manner.

She also acknowledged the Tablers for helping needy people without compensation.
